

Amazon Cruise – Vessels Delfin I & II



The Amazon rainforest constitutes over half of the planet's remaining rainforest. The Amazon River is the life force of the forest, rising in the Peruvian Andes and winding its way east over the northern half of South America until reaching the Atlantic Ocean.

Pacaya Samiria National Reserve is the largest protected flooded forest in the world, making it one of the primary intact swathes of rainforest in the Peruvian Amazon.

Our Amazon Cruises are organised through Delfin Cruises. Launched in early 2006 by its founder and CEO Aldo Macchiavello, a former senior banker, Delfin Amazon Cruises is the pioneer upscale river cruise operator in the Amazon. 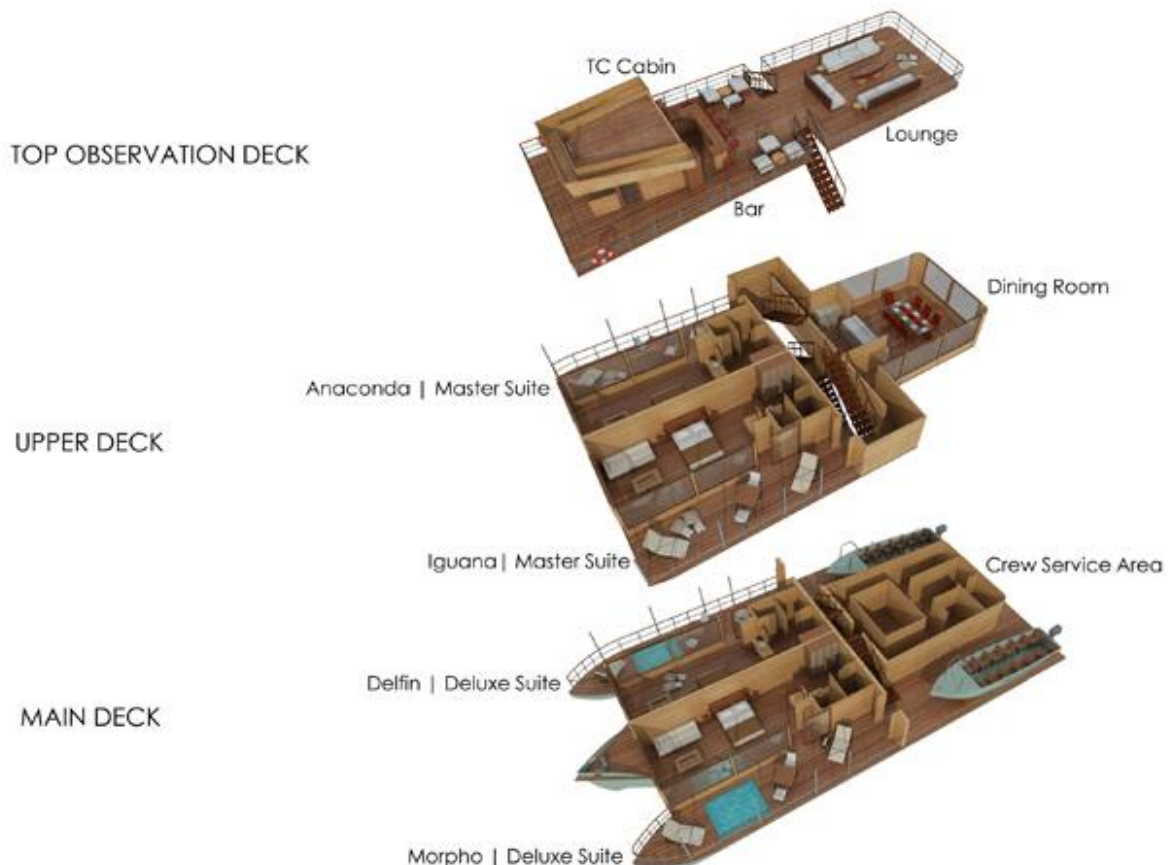
Delfin I – 12 passengers.

The Delfin I is a small, luxurious cruise ship, and perhaps the most personalized vessel currently operating on the Amazon River. It features 4 spacious deluxe suites, all of them with private terraces and two of them with private whirlpool baths. With an intimate atmosphere, the Delfin I provides a luxurious means of exploring the Amazon River and Rainforest.



DELUXE SUITES:

Located on the main deck, this two spacious suites of 360 square feet, features a king size bed, (or separate twins) who are wrapped on 180° panoramic windows from floor to ceiling, mini bar, in-suite seating area with a sofa bed (may be converted in one additional bed), fine Peruvian linens (with a threat counts in hundreds), environmentally friendly amenities, silent A/C units, hot water, hair dryer, safe deposit box and internal communications system. Our new addition is private terraces of 320 square feet with private cold-water whirlpool baths, being the first and only river vessel with this feature.



MASTER SUITES:

Located on the second deck, the two master suites of 340 square feet and a private deck of 320 square feet are a little smaller than the Deluxe Suites, though certainly spacious.

They share the same comforts as the deluxe suites but without the whirlpool baths; they feature panoramic windows from floor to ceiling and the same amenities as the deluxe suites.



The Delfin I is also equipped with an entertainment centre, a range of DVDs and reading material about the Amazon rainforest, different wildlife presentations, an Xcube (for children) and an open bar offering a variety of international and local drinks. Coffee and tea is always available.

Delfin II – 28 passengers.

A considerably larger vessel than the Delfin I, the Delfin II has fourteen large guest suites, including four master suites and ten standard suites – four of which can be interconnected to accommodate families. The Delfin II aims to provide all of the comforts expected of a world-class, luxury cruise ship, while retaining a relaxed and casual atmosphere.



The facilities on the Delfin II include a dining room on the second deck, an observation deck, a well-stocked bar, entertainment centre, library, and a hammock sun deck. The vessel is decorated with artwork by some of Peru's leading contemporary artists, some of which is available for purchase.

MASTER SUITES:

The four master suites are at the front of the vessel. They are spacious and beautifully decorated, with 180° panoramic windows, king-sized beds, sheets and Peruvian cotton bedspreads.

STANDARD SUITES:

The ten standard suites have extra-large windows from which you can enjoy the breathtaking views.

Four of the cabins are interconnected to cater for families.

All cabins have been designed with elegant interiors that create a welcoming and restful environment for those who want to get away from it all yet enjoy luxurious comfort.

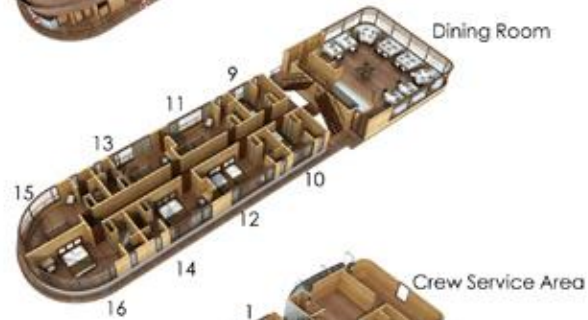


TOP OBSERVATION DECK



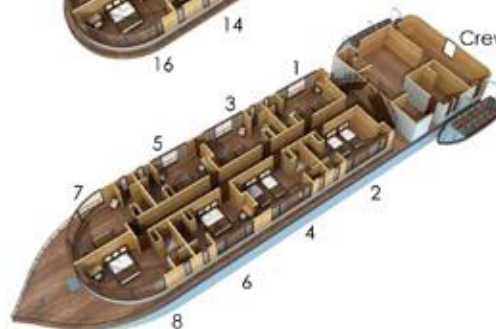
UPPER DECK

Notes:

Delfin I & II are true luxury river vessels that cruise the northern Amazon, and offer an extraordinary level of comfort. Delfin I, although small, and Delfin II, twice the size, offer many of the same amenities found on much larger cruise ships, but with a greater emphasis on privacy and personal attention.

The weather in Iquitos is warm and humid with average annual maximum temperature of 33°C (95°F) and minimum of 21°C (70°C).

The dry season is from May to November. The wet season is from December to April. The plant and animal life changes with the seasons, as does the climate, though not dramatically.

All activities are subject to change due to weather conditions and time of year. River and tributary levels may vary and thus navigation times and excursions may need to be modified at the captain's discretion.

Bring comfortable soft-soled shoes, light-weight trousers and long-sleeved tops, hat, sun glasses, lightweight rain gear, sunscreen, mosquito repellent, BINOCULARS, camera and spare batteries.

You may also wish to include some items that you can give away to the locals. (T-shirts, pens and paper are especially prized)

Tipping is expected by the crew and the guides; envelopes will be provided in your cabin and an amount of between 100 and 150 US Dollars is advised per passenger. Please bear in mind that this is merely a suggestion.
